



Senator-Professor Harold Ramkissoon was educated first at the University of the West Indies, and then at the Universities of Toronto and Calgary in Canada. A mathematician, he is currently Professor Emeritus at the University of the West Indies in Trinidad.

Professor Ramkissoon has made notable contributions to the understanding of micropolar and microcontinuum fluids and Marangoni instabilities and has played a pivotal role in the advancement of science in the Caribbean region. He has been the recipient of several awards, including the Chaconia Gold Medal, Trinidad and Tobago's second-highest national award; the Academic Gold Medal from Simón Bolívar University in Venezuela; and the First CARICOM Science Award.

Professor Ramkissoon is a founding member, former Past President and Fellow of the Caribbean Academy of Science, Fellow of the Academy of Sciences for the Developing World (TWAS), member of the European Academy of Sciences and Arts as well as a Corresponding Member of the Cuban Academy of Sciences and the Venezuelan Academy of Sciences. He is also the Immediate Past Executive-Secretary of CARISCIENCE. He is a native of Trinidad and Tobago.
